The National Child Passenger Safety Board is proud to announce the addition of Captain Robert White, NR-EMTP as the Board's newest Public Safety/Fire/EMS Representative for the 2014-2016 term. Captain White's work has been involved in the emergency services and medical field since 1987, and in 1990 he became a paramedic. Currently, White serves as the EMS Community Relations Coordinator at Piedmont Medical Center in Rock Hill, SC and as the co-chair of Safe Kids York County.

White's interest in child passenger safety began in 1998 after attending a car seat safety training class at his local health department. Working directly in the field, White has seen the injuries that children can sustain and as a result has become a strong advocate of injury prevention. In 1996, White was introduced to Safe Kids Worldwide and two years later founded the Safe Kids York County coalition in 1998. White and his team have expanded the number of permanent car seat check stations from one to four. These stations are strategically placed around York County. In 2000, he was trained as a nationally certified Child Passenger Safety (CPST) and shortly after, as a certified Child Passenger Safety Technician Instructor (CPST-I).

The mission of the National Child Passenger Safety Board is to maintain the quality and integrity of the national Child Passenger Safety Certification Training Program. This program is used to train and certify child passenger safety technicians and instructors. The Board welcomes Captain Robert White as a valued addition!
