National Child Passenger Safety Board Announces Four New Board Members

Itasca, IL – Today, the [National Child Passenger Safety Board](#) (NCPSB) announced the upcoming addition of four new members to its Board. Suzanne Cash LeDoyen, Tammy Franks, Meg Miller and Lindsay Pollok will serve during the 2016-2018 term.

“These four professionals have demonstrated incredible dedication to our children’s safety,” said Amy Artuso, NCPSB secretariat and program manager at the National Safety Council. “We hope to save even more lives and prevent injuries because of their appointment to the Board.”

Cash LeDoyen is a Public Health Educator at Wake County Human Services in North Carolina. She became a child passenger safety technician (CPST) 14 years ago and a CPST Instructor five years ago. A recipient of several child passenger safety awards, Cash LeDoyen was recognized as the National Child Passenger Safety Instructor of the Year in 2015.

Franks is the child passenger safety (CPS) coordinator at Randall Children’s Hospital at Legacy Emanuel in Portland, Oregon. Franks has been a CPST instructor since 1999, coordinates Oregon’s state CPS training grant and instructs the Safe Travel for All Children course throughout the U.S.

Miller is a Highway Safety Specialist for NHTSA’s Region 3, made up of District of Columbia, Delaware, Kentucky, Maryland, North Carolina, Virginia and West Virginia. Miller became one of the first nationally certified child passenger safety technicians in 1998, and became an instructor in 1999. Miller has been appointed to represent the 10 NHTSA Regions of the U.S.

Pollok is an injury prevention coordinator at Dell Children's Medical Center of Central Texas. Pollok is a CPST Instructor, and has completed the Safe Travel for All Children training for adaptive child restraints. Her accomplishments in public health and injury prevention resulted in her receipt of a John F. Finklea Scholarship from Johns Hopkins Center for Injury Research and Policy in 2014.
