Lorrie Lynn Named to National Child Passenger Safety Board

Itasca, IL – The National Child Passenger Safety Board (NCPSB) is proud to announce the appointment of Lorrie Lynn to the Board. She will serve as a National Safety Council (NSC) representative. Lynn is director of Grants and Evaluations at NSC with an additional focus on strategic planning.

Nothing is as important to Lynn as seeing that Sienna is properly restrained in an age- and weight-appropriate child safety seat. Because Sienna attends preschool, Lynn talks to other parents about car seats regularly and is known as a community advocate for child safety.

“It’s a great honor and opportunity to work with such passionate advocates for child safety,” Lynn said. “I hope to bring my expertise and my relationships to benefit the board as we continue to work on keeping children safe on the roads. But, it goes beyond roads. Every air flight we take Sienna on she is in her FAA-approved car seat. I think it is important that children are properly restrained on airplanes as well as in cars and on buses.”
